

CLA School of the Bible FAQ Sheet

Why:

- Along with providing a well-rounded bible education for Christians, we want to train the next generation of Bible Teachers and Christians who can defend their faith.

What:

- Our goal is to equip our students to thoroughly defend their faith and be able to teach the Bible to others if they choose to do so.

Who:

- The school is open to all.
 - i. Official students, identified as those who intend to teach, and who want to earn a teaching certificate. (will be tested and tracked)
 - ii. Those who want to audit the classes are welcome to register and attend.

When:

- Thursday evenings from 6:30 – 8:30 on specified dates.
 - Three trimesters of 10 weeks each annually. (no classes during June, July, August, or December)

Where:

- CLA main campus in The Plaza.

What is a passing grade on tests and exams?

- 70%

Do I have to register for the school?

- Yes, there is an on-line registry link on our website.

Is there a deadline for registration?

- No, students may register at any time.

Cost:

- There is no charge to attend the school.

Additional Notes:

- Classes will run for 3 years from class #1 through class #90 and then begin again with class #1. This is to create a perpetual cycle of bible training.
- Graduation certificates are awarded in November for all students who successfully completed the 90 classes during that school year.
- Each class begins promptly at 6:30 PM and ends at or before 8:30 PM.
- There is a 5-minute break at 7:30.
- Questions during each class are at the discretion of the teacher.
- There is always time for questions after class.
- Students will receive the class notes 1-2 days prior each class via email.
- Students will receive a REPLAY email after each class with video and audio links for any student who missed the class and wants to make up the work.

Off-hours Remote Learning Policy (01/25/23)

As the CLA School of the Bible grows more structure must be added to maintain the integrity of the school. One of the areas of concern involves what I am calling our "Off-hours Remote Learning Students". An "Off-hours Remote Learning Student" is the student who works on Thursday nights and cannot attend class in-person or on-line. Such absences are "excused absences". A note from your employer may be required.

Effective February 1, 2023, we will not graduate students who miss more than 10 classes due to unexcused absences in the three-year cycle. If you think your situation merits an exception, please write to Director of the School requesting an exception.
